



Strong government ownership

## RECOMMENDATIONS Land degradation



Assess climate risks and design responses



Consider complex contextual factors within an integrated approach framework



Implement land degradation neutrality with an appropriate mix of interventions



Strengthen M&E tools, knowledge dissemination



#### **FINDINGS**

## Legal and regulatory reform

Unrealistic expectations



Often necessary, not always sufficient





Wide range of activities to support governments

Many factors influence implementation and success

Limited follow-up and evaluation of impacts

### **EXAMPLES** Transformational change

#### **Uruguay**

Wind power 2008: 0%

2016: 33%

#### Africa

1.3 mln – quality solar lanterns; Private market transformed

#### **Amazon**

13.2 mln ha – strict protection

10.8 mln ha – sustainable use

#### China

4 criteria:

Relevant

Deep/Systemic

Large-scale

Sustainable

Wind power 2005: 1.3 GW

2015: 129.3 GW

#### Namibia

98% PAs improved

Doubled # of wild dogs, leopards, cheetahs, lions (2004-12)

156 projects - nominated and screened 30 cases (49 projects) – first review round

13 cases (29 projects) - second review round

8 cases (13 projects) - selected

## Transformational change

#### **LESSONS**

- ✓ Level of ambition
- ✓ Effective transformational mechanism
- Quality of implementation and execution
- ✓ Harnessing market forces
- ✓ May be achieved by projects of different size

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Develop and apply a framework for ex-ante assessments of projects/ programs that are intended to be transformational



## Results-based management


Plays a strong role in supporting reporting, accountability and communications

GEF has not articulated clear theories of change for its programs

GEF is still tracking too many indicators

Gaps in the submission and availability of tracking tools, quality of info is often poor

Project Management Information System has not kept pace

## Safeguard policies

Catalytic role in many GEF agencies



Identified a range of environmental and social risks in the GEF 6 Portfolio



Gaps in the GEF
Minimum Standards



Less-developed experience in safeguard implementation and monitoring in some agencies



Unsystematic tracking system means limited info on risks





Review the GEF Minimum Standards



Improve safeguards monitoring and reporting



Support capacity development, expert convening, and communications


